Zones of Regulation

At MPET we use The Zones of Regulation. This framework helps children identify and manage their emotions effectively.

The Zones of Regulation divides feelings into four categories:

- 1. Blue Zone
- 2. Green Zone
- 3. Yellow Zone
- 4. Red Zone



Encouraging your child to discuss which zone they're in at home can be very helpful. Questions like "What zone are you in?" can spark meaningful conversations.
